What it Means to be a Cooperative Baptist Fellowship Church

The following excerpt from a June 13, 2018, article by *Suzii Paynter in *The Dallas News* explains what it means to be a CBF church.

Four freedoms have formed the core of Baptist life historically, and the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship continues to affirm these values:

- Soul freedom: Every person has full access to God without the need for a human authority to mediate that relationship.
- Bible freedom: Individuals can and should interpret Scripture under the leadership of the Holy Spirit in consultation with others but not in obedience to others.
- Church freedom: Each local church is fully autonomous in its governance and is not answerable to a denominational hierarchy;
- Religious freedom: The separation of church and state provides the best protection for both religious minorities and majorities and for the secular government.

These freedoms yield diversity in the forms and practices of faith within the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship's denominational network. This diversity flows naturally from the Baptist preoccupation with the freedom of choice. One essential quality of CBF is diversity in expression and common devotion in love.

Cooperative Baptists were formed 27 years ago, in 1991, because of differences with the SBC over theology, church governance, and how to interpret the Bible. Chief among those differences was the belief among us that women should generally be granted equal opportunity to serve in any capacity alongside men. God does not discriminate by gender in granting gifts for leadership in the home, the church, or the world.

The beauty of CBF is also found in our mission-focused churches and in our people. Together, we form a "denomi-network" that provides maximum freedom with maximum cooperation in mission, ministry, and service to others that reflects the generous love of Christ. Each church can follow the leadership of the Spirit in the calling of that congregation.

Allowing churches to flourish in their context and culture and with the giftedness of their members reflects the scriptural image of one body with many distinct but cooperating parts. CBF welcomes churches and individuals of diverse beliefs and divergent practices, seeing those differences as opportunities for our communities of faith to learn from one another and grow.

Cooperative Baptists believe that the good news of the Gospel is still good news. We believe that being Baptist still matters and that Cooperative Baptists have an identity of compassion, seeking justice while serving and loving our neighbor in the example of Jesus Christ.

Looking ahead, we must make visible those things that matter - things like love, joy, peace, kindness, faithfulness, and perseverance. You know, those things about which all Baptists can agree.


Admission to the park is free - mention at the gate you are with First Baptist Bristol. This is a great time to invite an unchurched friend or neighbor.
