First Baptist Family,

With Ash Wednesday behind us, we have officially started our Lenten journey together. As you know, Lent is a period of forty days, excluding Sundays, that calls us to self-examination, repentance, self-denial, and prayer. It is a time in which we are encouraged to be more intentional about our relationship with Christ. There are two particular events this month that I think will help in that regard. On Thursday, March 12, the church is helping to sponsor a Community Poverty Simulation along with the United Way, the YWCA, Bristol's Promise, and Family Promise of Bristol. Initially, the simulation was going to be held in our Fellowship Hall, but there were fears that it would not be large enough given the number of participants who have already signed up. Therefore, it has been moved across the street to the gym at the YWCA. It will be from 1-4 p.m., and church members are invited to attend. I will be there, and I hope you will join me. It will be a powerful and thought-provoking experience. The second moving event I would like to bring to your attention is the King Lecture we are hosting on Monday, March 23 at 7 p.m. Every year, King University schedules a Holocaust survivor to speak during the lecture series, and this year the Holocaust Survivor lecture will be at First Baptist Bristol. The lecturer's name is Peter Gorog. This is the most well-attended lecture they have every year, so I would recommend getting to the church a little early if you plan to attend. While Lent is a time of preparation and repentance, the Sundays during Lent are a time of celebration, and we will have no shortage of that this month, either. We will have our monthly Family Breakfast at 9 a.m. on Sunday, March 1. Come join us for a good, filling breakfast and check out a Sunday School class if you are not already plugged into one. Then on Sunday, March 29, we are having a family fun night. We will be going to the local roller-skating rink from 5-7 p.m. Even if you don't skate, do not let that deter you from coming. There are plenty of seating options, which is where you'll find me! All in all, March is shaping up to be a great month in the life of the church. There are opportunities for fellowship and celebration, and we have more somber activities that fit perfectly within the season of Lent. I hope you will take advantage of some of these opportunities to become more rooted in the life of the church. I think you'll be glad that you did.

Notes from Leigh...

There is no such thing as something BIG.

I heard a discussion recently about the subject of "big" things. The speaker said that there are no big things because everything is made of a lot of "small" things. Let's think about that for a moment.

How often do we hesitate to attempt something because it seems "too big"? How many times have we decided to not even try? How could our thinking change if we considered the small steps we could take instead of only thinking of the end product.

For instance, with financial debt – we can't pay it all off at once. But, we can set a budget and pay one debt off at a time. In health improvement – we can't lose all the weight we need to lose or just begin running a 5k; we must train in small steps. Also, in our spiritual life – having a

meaningful relationship with God requires small steps of prayer, scripture reading, and discipleship. These small steps lead us into a deeper relationship with God and with our church community.

I want to encourage you during this Lenten Season to take some small steps – in your spiritual life and in any other areas that you feel God is calling you to something "big". God is faithful and He wants to use all of us for His Kingdom. He will equip us; we just have to take one small step at a time!
