On Sunday, September 29, beloved former pastor Bill Tuck will be joining us. Bill will be preaching in worship that morning, and he will also be sharing more about our Baptist history and heritage. Bill literally wrote the book on Baptist history, so I can think of no one better to lead such a discussion for this congregation. And on the evening of the 29th, we're going to have our church-wide Fall Festival. All in all, it's shaping up to be a great month! I would encourage you to make church attendance even more of a priority than it normally is because you're not going to want to miss any of the things we have planned. There's a great spirit and great energy in the church right now, and it's just what we need as we enter a time of harvest. Let's take the momentum we've built and use it to move forward together in faith!


