# THE FIRST WORD

August 2020

First Baptist Family,

Back towards the beginning of the year before any of us had ever heard of COVID-19, I presented an idea to the Board of Administration and Board of Deacons. They both gave their blessings. Now it's time to share that plan with the congregation, and for us to begin our first step. When I met with the BOA and Deacons, I told them that I wanted us as a congregation to put together a long-range strategic plan that examines the institutional, missional, and spiritual health of the church; a plan that imagines where we want the church to be in the year 2030, and a plan that forces us to put our goals on paper so we can work to achieve them together. The objective is for this plan to include measurable goals, a reasonable timeline, and estimated price tags for what we believe God is calling us to do. And I asked the BOA and the Deacons to select a group of 15 people to serve on this long-range planning team. Before we can do any of that, however, before people can be selected and work can begin, I believe it is vitally important that we as a congregation spend significant time in prayer. Because of that, we're going to be starting a 100-day prayer campaign as a congregation, and we're going to be starting it this August. The title of the prayer campaign is Boldly Go, and you're going to be hearing a lot about it moving forward. The basic premise is that everyone in the congregation will be encouraged to pray for the same thing every day for 100 days. As a staff, we've put together a prayer calendar that lists different item for you to pray for each day and for us to all pray for the same thing every Sunday of the campaign – that we have a united spirit and a bold faith. You'll notice that the prayer calendar begins with internal items and ends with external ones. That is intentional. The idea is that if we pray for and do the internal work we need to do as a congregation, then God will send us out to do Kingdom work together.

To help you in this prayer campaign, we've ordered everyone a white journal with the church's new logo on it for you to write down your thoughts and prayers. Kim Warren gave us a great deal on the journals and even threw in some nice pens as a gift to go with them. Additionally, we're putting together a packet that further explains the campaign. The packet also includes something you can use as a bookmark and it has questions to serve as prompts that can guide you through the campaign. For everyone who is able, we're asking that you come by the church on either Wednesday, July 29, or Friday, July 31, from 12-3 p.m. to pick up your journal, pen, and prayer campaign packet. We'll have a table set up in front of the breezeway, so you can remain in your car. And while we'll be masked and physically distanced, it will provide a great opportunity for us to see one another again. If you cannot come on either of those days, please let me know, and we'll find a way to get your journal to you.

The purpose of this prayer campaign is to enhance congregational unity prior to beginning any long-range plan and to provide space for God to stir our hearts and imaginations to what might be possible. We all have our own pet projects and priorities for the church. By starting with prayer, we can make sure we are following God's priorities rather than our own. Additionally, the prayer campaign allows us both to have a congregational focus when we're physically distanced from one another and it provides us a unifying force during an election year, a time that is naturally divisive. At the end of our *Boldly Go* campaign, I'll explain more about our next steps. In the meantime, I encourage to come by the church to pick up your prayer journal, continue to pray, and begin to ask God what God might be calling you to do individually and what God might be calling us to do as a congregation as we boldly go forward in faith together. Whatever the plan the selected team comes up with, it will only work if we remain united as a congregation, and prayer is the best way we can do that. Know that I am praying for all of you.
