March 2021

First Baptist Family,

Lent has officially begun. It started with our Ash Wednesday service on Wednesday, February 17 and will continue through Holy Week until we reach Easter on Sunday, April 4. Lent is a period of forty days, excluding Sundays, that calls us to be more intentional about our relationship with Christ. We can do that by praying more frequently, engaging in self-examination, repenting, and practicing self-denial. If you're like me, though, you've probably already been doing that. COVID has caused me to do all of those things with a greater frequency than ever before. In fact, it feels as though we've been in a Lenten-type season full of self-denial since last March. It seems as though Lent never left.

Out of curiosity, I looked back at my First Word article for our March 2020 edition. In it, I mentioned all sorts of events that we had planned for that month, many of which had to be cancelled. Last year we sponsored a Community Poverty Simulation along with United Way, the YWCA, Bristol's Promise, and Family Promise of Bristol. We were able to have that event, but the King University lecture we were supposed to host, the one with the Holocaust Survivor, had to be cancelled. The Family Fun Night that Ben planned for the end of March had to be cancelled, too. March 1, 2020 was the last time we had a monthly Family Breakfast. Since last March we've alternated meeting in person for worship and having online-only worship services. We started live-streaming our services. Wednesday Night Bible Study and Sunday School moved to Zoom. We've all gotten accustomed to wearing masks everywhere we go and dousing ourselves with hand sanitizer.

The world has changed a lot in the last year. Our plans have changed. Our thoughts and ideas on what it means to "go to church" have changed. But God hasn't changed. God's love for God's children hasn't changed. Our call to be redemptive agents for God's Kingdom,

our call to be Christ's hands and Christ's feet, those things haven't changed. The last year has been hard for everyone. And I know that the idea of entering another Lenten season when it feels like we never left the last one can be overwhelming. We all keep waiting, keep hoping for Resurrection. So, during Lent 2021, I want to encourage you. I want to encourage you to continue to draw closer to God, to continue to lean on God. I want to encourage you to continue to pray, to continue to engage in self-reflection, and to continue to remove the barriers that stand in your way to a closer relationship with God. Because if Lent teaches us anything, it teaches us that Resurrection is coming. And Resurrection is still coming, my dear brothers and sisters. So, journey on. Hope on. Resurrection will be here soon enough.

Even during times of pandemic and physical distancing, it remains a joy to be your pastor.
